ast year, a transitional year for FCAA, was one full of excitement and energy, as we vowed to "Strengthen The Legacy with Unshakable Faith". Over <u>800</u> promising young athletes are provided instruction and guidance in learning teamwork, commitment and discipline, while showcasing their athletic abilities through our Health/Wellness & Sports Department. Over <u>300</u> parents attend our monthly parent meetings and workshops for discussions on various meaningful topics.

### Head Start

CAA's Head Start Program, funded by Miami Dade County Community Action and Human Services Department, served 500 Head Start and 24 Early Head Start infants and toddlers during the 2016-2017 school year. The Head Start/Early Head Start program continues to use its resources to maximize services that improve health and build cognitive development in children while moving families to high levels of self-determination.

Age-appropriate activities assure the positive development of cognitive, physical, social and emotional development of the children served. These activities equipped 228 children with the skills needed to transition into kindergarten ready to succeed.

## Community Partnerships

hanks to the efforts of the family services staff, 385 of the 522 families served received social services through family partnership and the referral process.

FCAA collaborated with local businesses who provided mental and behavior assessments, dental, vision, physical and immunization screenings. Thanks to this collaboration, dental services improved this year with 97.3% of children having a "Dental Home," and 85% received a professional exam and preventative care. In addition to that, of the children served, 95.5% had medical insurance and 85% were up-to-date on a schedule of age appropriate, preventive and primary health care at the end of the program year; and 86% of all children were also up-to-date on all immunizations.

During its Family Enrichment and Recruitment Fair, FCAA also collaborated with The Center for Family and Child Enrichment, Inc; Opa-Locka Community Development Corporation; A & T Health and Safety Institution; Miami-Dade Department of Corrections; and Miami-Dade College Community Education Department to provide various services to parents. Over 75 children received free fingerprinting, and parents received information about home buying and continuing education.



## **FAMILY SERVICES**

## Elementary Schools After School Care Program

CAA's After School Program provides a secure environment to children during non-school hours while their parents work or attend school. FCAA provides After School Care services in 8 Miami-Dade County Public Schools and serves over 580 children in Before and After Care. This program provides structured recreational and physical activities, homework assistance and healthy snacks for participants.

## S.T.A.R.S. Program

CAA's S.T.A.R.S. After Care program, funded by The Children's Trust, promotes positive growth and development in children at underperforming schools through tutoring, arts, sports and social enrichment.

In 2017, 93% of S.T.A.R.S. participants made significant improvements in literacy skills and physical fitness performance. 91% made improvements in oral reading fluency and 100% made improvements in reading comprehension and social-emotional learning. The program also helps develop their innate artistic gifts and learn healthy eating habits. The S.T.A.R.S. program is provided at 7 After School Care sites and serves 565 participants.

## Summer Camp

ver 100 youths enjoyed 9 weeks of fun during summer camp. Campers enjoyed educational field trips, participated in music, arts & crafts, swimming, and physical fitness activities. They also received academic enhancement in the areas of Reading and STEM, which was provided by certified teachers.

Based on feedback from both the youth and their parents, the camp was well received and considered one of the best camp experiences they've had. Camp ended with a talent show, which allowed participants to share their special gifts. Many parents, family and friends attended this event.

## Teen Christian Conference

CAA hosted 40 youth during its Annual Teen Christian Conference in Miami.

The conference theme was "Giving POWER to Dreams." Ms. Tranise Brown, founder and owner of Brown Athletic, was the keynote speaker. She inspired the youth through her story of entrepreneurship and shared her journey from a foster child to a successful business woman. Attendees also enjoyed gender-specific training from a panel of professionals from the community.

The conference culminated with the youth taking an overnight trip to Orlando where they enjoyed a skating outing and an eventful day at Sea World Aquatica Water Park.

## College Tours

CAA sponsored three college tours, including two local and one statewide. The local tours included visits to Florida Memorial University and Florida International University. Florida State University, Florida A&M University, The University of Florida and The University of Central Florida were the statewide campuses visited by 40 youth.

The students were able to make connections with the campus program supervisors, where they received important information that they can use for future reference. 97.5% of the students who attended the college tour felt that they gained valuable information about college life and the admission process.

### Graduation Stole Presentation

CAA presented its inaugural Graduation Stole to the graduating class of 2017.

Each year the graduating seniors that have participated in the Teen Leadership Club will receive an FCAA Teen Club Graduate Stole to wear at their high school graduation. This new initiative will encourage younger students to strive for the same accomplishments as those who have received stoles.
